This assignment is based on:

- Suzanne Last Stone, "The Intervention of American Law in Jewish Divorce" (2000), pp. 174-85
- Optional: Archbishop of Canterbury, Rowan Williams, "Civil and Religious Law in England: A Religious Perspective" (2008)

Detailed Instructions: In well-written paragraphs (a total of 500–600 words if you don't address Question 2; a total of 600–700 words if you <u>do</u> address Question 2), please address the following question(s) with detailed reference to the text:

1. According to

- a) Suzanne Last Stone; and
- b) at least three persons interviewed for the radio documentary "Faith in the Law" (briefly characterize and give the name of those whose views you cite),

what are some specific challenges posed by the issue of Jewish religious divorce (the *get*) for how we understand the separation of religion and secular law?

2. (Optional)

Does the issue of Jewish religious divorce in the secular state help to illustrate any of Rowan Williams's ideas about "plural jurisdiction"?

Please <u>number your answers</u> to the individual questions.

As was the case for the Text Summary assignment, all your observations about the text should be backed up with references that allow your reader to see what they are based on; for this purpose, please use in-text parenthetical page references, as in this sample sentence:

Locke underscores that acts of violence are sometimes perpetrated "upon pretence of Religion" (23).

For parenthetical references to Stone and Williams, please use author name + page number. For references to "The Current"/"Faith in the Law," use "The Current"; and please also identify the person you are citing.

Please print your assignment <u>double-spaced</u> and with <u>one-inch margins</u>, using an 11–12-point font. Please number and staple the pages you hand in. Please write "Text Preparation 5" at the top, and indicate the total word count at the end.

<u>Note</u>: Since this is your first reading of this text, and since we have not yet discussed it in class, the summary assignment is simply a first effort at figuring out what it says, and doing it will help you get the most of our in-class work on it. The assignment is not evaluated for whether it demonstrates a good understanding of the reading, but for evidence of your having worked in detail to understand the reading. Your fuller understanding will develop in the course of our class meetings, and with successive re-readings.
